Educational methods

Educational methods applied in this course are lectures, seminars, group work and individual tasks. Students are expected to actively participate in discussions.



Examination

Examination tasks are both oral and written, and include active participation in group sessions and seminars (2 hp) and three written assignments (5.5 hp). If an obligatory session is missed, students are required to submit a compensatory written assignment – details will be provided at the start of the course. Students who fail are offered one re-examination occasion in close connection to the course. After that participation in a coming course examination is offered. The re-examination should be equally comprehensive as the ordinary examination.

Change of examiner

Students who have failed the course or part of the course twice are entitled to request another examiner for the following examination occasion.
